Death is like sleep while we await the resurrection

Hell is the grave

Hebrew: Sheol grave, death, or hell

Hebrew Sheol grave, death, or hell

Greek: Hades grave, death, or hell "in mourning will I go down to the grave [Sheol] to my son." So his father wept for him.

If the only home I hope for is the grave [Sheol]... where then is my hope?... Will it go down to the gates of death [Sheol]? Will we descend together into the dust?"

At death, the spirit (ruach or pneuma) returns to God

Nature of Salvation

Judgment is at the resurrection, not at death
